NOTICE OF DETERMINATION DEVELOPMENT CONTROL PLAN NO. 21 COROWA SHIRE (MURRAY RIVER) FLOOD RISK MANAGEMENT DEVELOPMENT CONTROL PLAN

Public notice is given that Corowa Shire Council at its 20 October 2009 monthly meeting adopted Development Control Plan No. 21. The Plan applies to the whole of the Corowa Shire.

DRAFT AMENDMENT TO DEVELOPMENT APPLICATION NOTIFICATION POLICY

Council at its 20 October 2009 monthly meeting resolved to vary its Development Application Notification Policy. Presently all adjoining properties to a development lot are notified in writing plus an advertisement is placed in a local circulating newspaper.

The proposed variation will see all properties within 40 metres of the development lot being notified by written notice plus an advertisement will continue to be placed in a local circulating newspaper.

Interested persons are invited to make comment or submission concerning any aspect of the draft variation. Submissions or objections in writing will be received by the General Manager up until 5:00 pm on Friday 27 November 2009.

PROPOSAL TO NAME BARNES STREET, MULWALA AND BILLY DAY COURT, HOWLONG

In accordance with the requirements of the Geographical Names Board, the Roads Act 1993 and Roads (General) Regulation 2008. Corowa Shire Council proposes that the following road be named:

- (1) Section of road between Savernake Road and North Street Mulwala to be named **BARNES STREET**.
- (2) Section of road adjoining Gibson Place Howlong to be named **BILLY DAY COURT**.

Submissions in respect to comments or objections regarding the proposed road naming, is to be specific to that proposed road name and should be made in writing to: General Manager Corowa Shire Council, PO Box 77, Corowa NSW 2646.

If the submission is made by the way of objection, then the grounds of objection must be specified. All submissions are to be received by Friday 27 November 2009.

ANIMAL/PET SECURITY

STAGE 2A WATER RESTRICTIONS URBAN AREAS DAYLIGHT SAVINGS TIMES

Watering restrictions have been revised as follows and will remain in force until further notice:

- Odd numbered houses may water Tuesdays and Saturdays from 6.00am to 8.00am and from 6.00pm to 8.00pm on both days.
- Even numbered houses may water Wednesdays and Sundays from 6.00am to 8.00am and from 6.00pm to 8.00pm on both days.
- Gardens can be watered using a handheld hose with trigger nozzle or using an automatic sprinkler system.
- Lawns can be watered using a handheld hose with trigger nozzle or using an automatic sprinkler system.
- Movable sprinklers are not allowed.
- Parks, school grounds and sports fields may be watered.
- Vehicles may be washed on a grass surface using a handheld hose with trigger nozzle anytime.
- Pools and spas may be topped up with a hand held hose with trigger nozzle if the pool/spa has a pool cover which is in place at all times when the pool/spa is not in use.
- Commercial vehicles that require cleaning for OH&S reasons may be cleaned using a high pressure washer. Records of use are to be kept.
- Exemptions will be considered on application.
- Council will review water restrictions requirements on a monthly basis.

Residents and businesses are reminded that the water shortage is critical and all efforts should be made to save water.
